The OneStop service is part of Azaleos' OneServer suite, which implements a dedicated device into an IT network that provides an active/passive, fault-tolerant and clustered Exchange platform for enterprise messaging. Funambol's Open Source Wireless SyncFunambol, an open source software development company that specializes in mobile application servers, is now providing a free open source email sync application for the iPhone. Starting this week, iPhone users will be able to sync their Personal Information Management (PIM) data for free via the company's myFunAMBOL portal to popular email systems like Gmail, Yahoo and AOL. Funambol's wireless sync platform, which is supported through advertising, is also available on Windows Mobile and BlackBerry devices, and will soon be available on Google Android devices as well. The software for the application can be downloaded directly from myFunAMBOL site. For anyone tired of having their wallet or wallet overstuffed with business cards, 211me's paperless business card could be just the ticket. 211me, which describes itself as a mobile mash-up company, lets users generate their own maps, flyers and campaigns designed specifically for mobile phones. Companies can thus create digital business cards for their employees or campaigns that can be sent electronically to phone in the United States. Any flyers and business cards can also be shared on social networking sites like Facebook and Friendster, the company said. Users can design their own content by uploading their images to the 211me website, where they can then choose from a wide range of backgrounds and text styles. The concept behind RemindYou is remarkably simple - essentially, its goal is to ensure you never miss another deal ever again. And how does it do that, you ask? Well, by syncing up with iCal, Outlook or Entourage and then overlay a graphic of all your appointments over the iPhone start-up image. Nuance is now working to bring its voice recognition technology to the iPhone to drastically reduce the need for users to peck away at qwerty keyboards. Over the past two years, Twitter has taken the online world by storm as a happy medium between blogging and texting. By letting users post updates of up to 140 characters on their Twitter social networking pages, Twitter has emerged as a popular way for people to provide real-time updates about their work and life to their friends and colleagues. Twitterfic, an interface developed by software company iconfactory, is designed specifically to provide Twitter capabilities to Mac users and has been available for prison-broken iPhones since last year.
